Vice President's Message Waldo Bueing

Greetings to all members of District Two, I trust everyone has had an eventful summer and are ready to start the fall full of energy and new ideas.

I have mailed out a lot of letters welcoming all new members to lodges 999 and 000, along with letters to lodges Vice Presidents advising them of the new members and inviting them to contact these members to transfer their membership to a local lodge. They can then receive the full benefits of membership in Sons of Norway.

Thanks to the efforts of our local lodge Vice Presidents, 45 members have transferred to local lodges through July in 2007. This is among the highest of all districts, and thanks go to all Vice Presidents for taking the time to follow up on my letters

International gave us several goals they would like us to accomplish. One goal is membership committees in at least 70% of our lodges by the end of 2007. As of July, we have 22 lodges with membership committees which is 45%. Not bad, but with a little more effort I think we can achieve 70%. So if your lodge does not have an active membership committee, please consider forming one.

Another goal is getting non-member children of members to join Sons of Norway. When a focus group was held in Minneapolis it was determined we were just not asking our children to join. So this it what we have to focus on: Heritage members upon turning 16 until age 23 are eligible to apply for free membership. For a free membership, fill out the regular membership form; please write your name, membership number and your relationship with the new member somewhere in the margin of the form. Enter \$0 in the total dues space. How simple is that.

We also need to come up with some ideas on how to contact non-member children of members where the children live in a different area. We also need ideas on how to attract children of members who live in the area but for some reason or another have never been asked to join Sons of Norway.

Our membership growth rate has not been achieved. At the end of May, we were 42 members from Jan 1; remember our goal is to have at least 1 more member than we started with. So Please Financial secretaries and Vice Presidents contact people on your list whose dues are past due and who has been dropped from some reason. We have a lot of work to do but it is not impossible!

Message from the International Director Bill Fosmoe

An update on where District Two stands with regard to the 2006 – 2008 Biennium membership goals as of June 30, 2007:

- During this period, District Two has lost 65 members either by death or not renewing their membership.
- We have increased our membership in the 40 to 55 year old category by 24 members.
- District Two has the highest increase in membership in this category for all of Sons of Norway.
- Our growth in insurance products has decreased.

I know all lodges are working hard to keep up our membership. Hopefully, most lodges have a membership committee chaired by the lodge vice president who is working with the District Two Vice President in promoting membership in Sons of Norway.

John Lund, Chief Executive Officer, has advised that there will be changes in the IRS Form 990 by the Internal Revenue. All lodges, even though those that have less than \$25,000 in annual

receipts, will need to file with the Internal Revenue Service. The form is to be called a 909N. It will be a short post card type form which at this time is still being developed. The 990N will be used for the tax year 2008. This return is to be filed in the year 2009.

Those lodges that have more than \$25,000 in annual receipts will still have to complete and file the IRS Form 990 in the normal manner.

My heartiest congratulations to the Border Festival Committee chaired by Elaine Grasdock of Wergeland Lodge #21 and District Two Counselor for a great 60th anniversary Border Festival held on July 8th. This is a great picnic for lodges in District Two and District Seven.

Congratulations to Tordenskjold Lodge #5 who celebrated their 100th anniversary on September 8, 2007. What a milestone!

Therefore Be It Resolved that the International Lodge support a process to review the current Constitutions as to its components and their relevancy to the laws and governance of our Society; and

Be It Further Resolved that the International President shall appoint a special committee to develop a re-ordered constitution and companion document which will be reviewed by the International Board during the 2006-2008 biennium and/or any other member groups. The committee shall submit a report to the 2008 International Lodge Meeting.

The eight member Constitution Committee was appointed by President Fosberg. I am one of the members and have to admit that this is a **major** task. Here is an update of our work:

- No changes to the Charter
- Develop a Policy and Procedures Document
- Renumber the Constitution to correspond with the Policy & Procedure Document

Currently, any changes to the Constitution needs a 2/3 vote, and as we read through it, there are sections dealing with officer duties, membership administration, new lodge development etc. that should only require a majority vote. These paragraphs would be placed in the companion document. We envision that the new documents (Policy & Procedures) will be available on the website.

The Committee will present the proposed documents to the International Board for their input. Then the completed project will be outlined at all 2008 District Conventions and further to the 2008 International Lodge Meeting.

There will be no changes to the present verbiage in the Constitution and all paragraphs will be placed in the Constitution, Policy or Procedure Documents. We hope the final product will be more "user friendly" for all members.

Greetings to all. I hope that you are having a terrific summer and enjoying those special activities that summer brings to us all. Regina and I attended the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singer's Association 98th Annual Sangerfest in Astoria in June and the Junction City Scandinavian Festival this past weekend and had a great time savoring all of the sights, sounds, foods and friendship that gatherings of this type brings to us. At events of this nature, the community outreach for all things Scandinavian is truly amazing.

I have included for publication in this issue a financial report for January through July of 2007. Thanks primarily to the dues increase at the last convention, the district is in sound financial shape. Although expenses continue to rise, we have been able to increase our account balances to an aggregate total of \$\$44,830.36 as of July 31.

This compares favorably with the balance in July, 2005, the last non-convention year, of \$35,024.14.

What this means for our members is that we have had the funds to invest in some special projects we have been putting off for some time. The first of these is that we are in the process of revamping the District web page. This makes us more visible to the public and hopefully more attractive to prospective members. The second is that we have been able to purchase laptop computers for both the Secretary and the Treasurer, which will make our jobs much easier, especially at future meetings and conventions. These had been voted on more than a year ago, but I felt that we could not make these purchases with the amount of funds on hand at the time. In addition, we should be in a much better position by next year to assist our delegates in attending the International Convention.

Adopt a School Program Coordinator - Sid Iverson

The Joy of Exciting Kids of Every Age. Sons of Norway's "Adopt a School" Program

The new school year has started and for many schools there is a need to find ways to reinforce the excitement in the classroom. Through Sons of Norway's Adopt a School program our lodges can help provide some additional sparkle to the learning process.

Pick an idea and develop a twist to that idea that might provide some intrigue. As Norwegians, we all know about the Vikings and the reputations they had. But, how about "The rest of the story?" Try your idea out on your lodge first. Your members might enjoy it, too.

In school we are introduced to the historical idea that our form of government comes from the model used by the English. Their two house system is the basis for our two house Congress. but nobody addresses the question of the source of the English system. Just think how intriguing it might be if a presentation might be made showing the connection between Norway to Iceland back to Norway then to Europe by way of William the Conqueror and finally to the British and their Parliament.

When we want to show a father - son relationship we might use "the second or the third, 4th" and so on. In Norway to show a relationship we might use the father's name then define the son by providing a descriptive term like "the Fair", or "Blood axe", or "the Red". In Scotland and Ireland, the prefix "Mc" or "Mac" to a name means "Son of" From what country did these two prefixes come? How come so much of Irish history and geography seems to contain a Norsk flavor? Are the Irish really close cousins to the Norwegians?

All around the world there are stories about the little people, the hidden folk. We know about the elves, the fairies, the leprechauns and the trolls. Are they related to Kilroy, the gremlins or the grinches? What role do they play in the lives of children? Of grownups? Who are the Huldafolk and how are

they, even today, impacting the lives of one of our Nordic neighbors?

Answers to questions such as these are as close as your computer or the reference material at Sons of Norway. Don't be afraid to take some reality information that is not included in the normal school curriculum and shake the tree a little bit. Have fun in doing it.

Were you aware of the fact that two of Norway's historical instruments are the Mouth Harp and the Musical Saw. How much fun could one have in demonstrating these two instruments - or maybe even? Having some of the kids make some music with a saw. How about the story of the lowly paper clip?

Don't be afraid to jump into the water and get wet. It might even be fun.

I hope you all have had a wonderful summer. I had my dream summer in Lofoten, Northern Norway with sun every day for three weeks. From time to time, I have heard people telling me about this wonderful weather in Lofoten, but, in the 56th years since I left, it's the first time it has happened to me and I go there on the average every other year!

When this newsletter arrives, we are into the fall activities and bazaars will be held and lutefisk made for big crowds.

There are a couple of items I like to put your attention to. First, should we continue with the lefse contest? I think we should but should we include other kinds of lefse too or just stick to potato lefse? Or, should we have only more lefse this year?

By including different kinds, we lefse lovers will be able to extend our lefse recipes and hopefully go home and use them. I need your suggestions as soon as possible because I am facing a hip replacement in the end of September.

The second item I'd like to point out is that October is Foundation month. Last year, I suggested for Leif Erikson, my lodge that we asked the members for a dollar each and then the lodge matched the amount we collected. We sent in to the Foundation \$100.00; not too much but if every lodge participated it would amount to a substantial amount of money.

Even the smallest lodge should be able to come up with \$20.
